

Short-listed paintings on show

Silpakorn University Art Centre presents the "14th Panasonic Contemporary Painting Exhibition" which showcases 42 paintings shortlisted from more than 160 entries sent to a competition hosted earlier by Panasonic Thailand.

The paintings portray happiness in its various forms, and from the perspective of artists, while the exhibition itself is an attempt to reflect society under the concept "For the Happiness of Mankind". The highlights are the top three pieces at the competition,

where the first prize was Anchalee Araya-pongpanich's "Hero Woman" that captures the sparks of a woman who sees herself as a champion.

Second prize was Anthikar Kunawat-tanakul's "I Was Born To Be Your Victim No. 2" which seeks to convey that society has changed dramatically including the way we consume.

Third prize went to Krissadank Intasorn's "The Secret Of Blossom Lady" depicting hidden agendas and dubious souls.
